The competition has to stop. The slandering against other teachers, denominations and churches has to stop.

Denominations suck. But that's what the church has become in the last 2000 years. That probably won't change anytime soon.

But what can change is your perspective on the other churches around you.

I'm not really a fan of reality television. And mostly I think the name of the category "reality tv" is a misnomer. Most reality television isn't reality. Partially because the cameras effect the real life. I mean, really, if you had a camera watching you, you would act different, you would. But there is another aspect of reality

television that is interesting. The reality shows that we love to watch says something about us. What reality shows do you like? "The Bachelor" communicates that we have a really skewed view of courtship. "COPS" might say that we like seeing other people's messes because it makes us feel better about our own messes. "American Pickers" could communicate that we love to see junk, something with seemingly no value at all, become worth something when brought into the light. I could go on, but along those same lines "Hoarders" says something profound and disturbing about our culture. It too, in a way, makes us feel better about what we hoard, because the people featured are extreme cases. But we all hoard, don't we? Are you uncomfortable yet?

I think the American church has a hoarding sickness. We want the blessing of God. We ask for the blessing of God. We ask again for God to bless us. But most of us never seek to pass that blessing on. Have you ever wondered why it is that you ask for God to bless you and feel like He isn't, can't, or won't? Perhaps it's because He already has and you need to pour out some blessing before there is room to be blessed again. Perhaps.

Consider a few scriptures with me. Ephesians 1:3 says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ." Our cup of blessing is filled, having been fulfilled in Christ Jesus. Genesis 12:1-3 is the call of Abram. Notice the Language. "The LORD had said to Abram, 'Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. 'I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you.'" God's blessing is never meant to be hoarded, kept to ourselves. Anything that is hoarded eventually destroys. God's blessing is meant to be used to bless others.

Do you want to be blessed? Do you want to be continually blessed? If you look for God's blessing, then bless others. God has blessed you, bless others. Then you will be blessed, and you can continue to bless. It's a beautiful cycle. That's the kind of reality the church needs to live out.

## GUT IT OUT!

The things you invest in the most are the things you will love the most. The more blood, sweat, and tears, you pour into something, the more you will cherish it in the end. For example, I hate cats. I'm sorry if you are a cat person (Drew Peterson), but I hate them. I am allergic to them, they think they are better than me, and they are lazy. But when I was a very young boy my parents got me a kitten. They didn't know I was allergic at the time.

That cat lived longer than any cat should. It has only been a couple of years since she died. So, I spent a lot of time with her. I played with her, despite the sneezes and itchy eyes. I fed her and gave her water. I took care of her. I went to veterinary appointments with her. I suffered one actual case of cat scratch fever (unfortunately, not just a song). And after years spent with this cat, I was sad to see her go. That's right. I, a person who hates cats, actually loved a cat.

The word *agape* is one of the words used in the New Testament for love. It describes a kind of love that deals with hard work. It is the kind of love that is to care for the needs of someone, even when that person is unlovely and undeserving. It is not motivated by self-interest or the attractiveness of the one loved, but by a sincere interest in that person's well-being.

When a coach sees his players slacking or not giving their all, he may yell something like "GUT IT OUT!" This means that he wants them to dig deep, fight past the agony, and proceed with force toward the goal. The *agape* kind of love requires us to gut it out.

*Agape* is the word used in John 3:16 while describing how God loves the world. He gave His only Son. Talk about hard work for the undeserving. *Agape* is also the word used in Ephesians 5:25-27 which says, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless."

Sadly, most of us didn't enter into marriage with this in mind. We found someone who was physically attractive to us, shared similar interests and passions, and made us feel good. None of these attributes are bad. In fact, they are good. However, they are not guaranteed to last. We all change. Our looks change, our interests change, we become comfortable with our mate rather than infatuated by them. Life distracts us from each other. The person you married years ago could be a very different person now. Guess what. You're probably a different person, too. Therefore, your love has to change. *Agape* is absolutely necessary.

Gut it out! Care for your mate even if you don't feel like it. Make them feel special even when you don't want to be around them. Be romantic even if the fire seems to have died out a long time ago. It's still there. You just have use flint now rather than a lighter. And when you get that fire lit, you will cherish it more because you worked hard for it. You will feel like fighting for it again because after all you poured into it, you are not about to let it go out and start over again. Falling out of superficial love is easy to do. Falling out of *agape* is not an option.

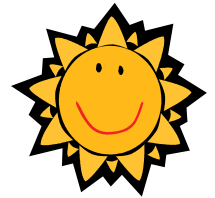


### Branson Senior Adult Conference

We often hear someone say, "God is good." But, more than likely, we've not heard someone say, "God is generous." He is. Our God is generous toward us. He is generous with His love, grace and forgiveness – "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace which He lavished on us." (Eph. 1:8) He enables us to live in one of the most powerful nations in the world, enjoying freedom and material blessings. He provides us with food, shelter and clothing—and even more. God is generous.

Are we to keep God's generosity to ourselves? Absolutely not! We have been made in the image of God, meaning we can be like Him. Since God is generous toward us, we must be generous toward God and others. There's something about being generous that is life-giving and liberating to the human spirit. The question is...are you generous?

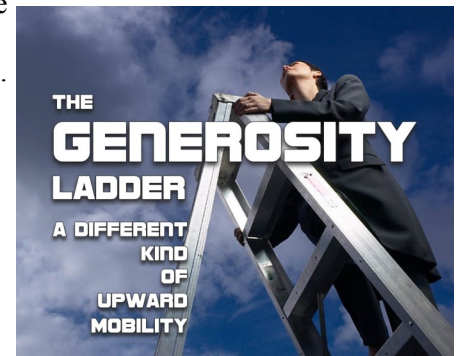
