GRACE GIVING

You know how important it is to get the first button of a shirt or vest fastened correctly. If you don't get the first one right, every button will be out of order – and you will look foolish even in your expensive suit. The same is true with your finances. If you don't fasten your generosity button first, all your other money buttons (saving, spending, investing) will be out of order, and you'll be confused and look foolish before God. However, if you are willing to start with the right button by allowing your

finances, time, lifestyle, work, and wealth to be governed by biblical principles – to completely surrender them to God – you will experience God's direction and care in your life in ways you've never dreamed possible. Your life will be pleasing to God and He will be glorified!

Giving Your Life To Christ

To stay with the illustrations a bit longer...you need to be wearing the right shirt – a pure and spotless one that can only come from Christ. You need to understand that no amount of money, good works, or possessions is enough to purchase or merit God's favor. God's salvation is offered freely to those who yield their heart and life to Christ and are obedient to Him.

Giving – Not Because You Have To, But Because You Want To!

Christian giving is not a natural act, but a supernatural act of God in your life. It is God's grace and love that will give you the ability to give and share according to what He's given you. Your Christian giving is to be more delight than drudgery, more privilege than pressure, more anticipation than anxiety, and more worshipful than worrisome!

God loves a cheerful giver (2 Cor. 9:7) and he wants us to give voluntarily of our own free will (Ex. 35:5; Lev. 22:17,18). He wants us to trust Him completely, believing that He will care for us and guide our lives (Prov. 3:5,6).

Giving Gracefully

Each act of giving and generosity to the Lord and to others is a testimony to your willingness to TRUST God in your life. Each time you give, you are acknowledging God's grace in your life and your total and complete dependence on Him as your Heavenly Father. The opposite of this is true as well. Not to give faithfully to the Lord's work is a sign that you're unwilling to trust God in your life. D.L. Moody, the famous Christian leader once said, "If you don't have much, but give – you will have more. But if you don't give, whatever you have will never be enough."

"But just as you excel in everything...

see that you also excel in this grace of giving."

Preach Without Words?

“Preach the gospel at all times — If necessary, use words.” -Saint Francis of Assisi

This is a great quote from a powerful theologian and preacher from Italy in the twelfth century. It’s a phrase that’s quoted and used a lot today in churches around the world. A phrase that Christians justify and hold up in their own lives. A phrase that is brought up when asked to share Jesus with your loved ones and friends.

“I shouldn’t have to push Jesus onto my friends through my words. They should be able to see Him in how I act and how I treat others. Not with pushing Bible verses on them. That’s how I preach to them. That’s how I share Jesus with them. I don’t need to use words at all.”

This sounds like a great principle, but I don’t agree with it. In my opinion, it’s a copout.

The call to “Come and die” (Luke 9:23) from Jesus isn’t a call to come to Jesus, die to our sinful selves, and be silent about the new life that we have received in Him. It’s not a call to receive the gift of grace, repentance, and salvation found only in Jesus then shut our mouths and not tell anyone about it.

Should our actions change as a result of becoming a follower of Jesus? Yes.

Should our choices change as a result of choosing Jesus? Yes.

Should others be able to notice Jesus through the way we act and make decisions? Definitely.

However, because we have experienced grace and new life through the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, should we expect to preach only through our actions and expect others to see Jesus just through that? No.

In Acts, the early church couldn’t shut up about what Jesus had done and was doing in their own lives! Peter and John, after being told by officials to quit preaching the Gospel of Jesus, said:

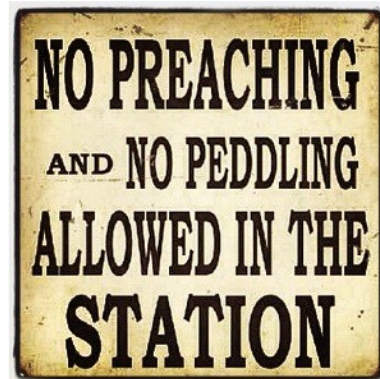
We cannot stop telling about everything we have seen and heard. (Acts 4:20)

This doesn’t change for us today even though we aren’t persecuted in the same way as the first century Christians. We should preach the Gospel with words. We should look for opportunities to preach, to those who don’t *know* Him, the hope that we have experienced, of the agape, undying love that has been shared with us, and of the promised hope of salvation and new life that we experience today and for eternity to come.

Preach when the opportunity arises in a conversation. Preach with your actions and how you react to certain situations. Preach when others are discouraged. Preach when others are in a great mood. Preach of the new life that is promised in Jesus Christ. Preach with your words. Preach with your actions. Preach with all of your life.

Here’s what Saint Francis should have said:

Preach the Gospel at all times.

How you act . . .

shows what you worship! It's a bit intimidating isn't it? Jesus said it this way, "Likewise, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus, by their fruit you will recognize them." (Matthew 7:17-20)

It's a bit en Vogue (or cliché even) in circles of Worship ministers or worship ministry students to talk about worship being something we do all the time. God has given us every moment to live out for His Glory and His kingdom. The truth is that this kind of life is very difficult. God never said it would be easy, just that He would be with us. The question is, are we with Him? And if we can tell a tree by it's fruit, and we can see what we worship by how we act, then let us strive all the time to produce, as an act of worship, the fruit of the spirit.

So let's look at a few of the fruit and see what this actually looks like. If there are people we can't stand to be around we aren't producing Love and it isn't Worshipping God. If we are always grouchy and everyone makes us mad and we snap at people, we aren't producing joy and it isn't worshipping God. If we are hoping that people get what they deserve and tell others about it in order to start the process (not to mention that it's gossip) we aren't producing peace and it isn't worshipping God. If we constantly talk to traffic, or murmur about the lines being too long at Wal-Mart, it isn't patience and it isn't worshipping God. Are you kind? Is your life producing Goodness? Gentleness? Are you faithful and self-controlled? If we aren't those things, then we aren't worshipping God. But we are still worshipping. It's just that we are worshipping ourselves, our money, our culture, etc. We give worth to anything in which we devote our thoughts, time, and resources. And worth-ship is worship. If we're not worshipping God, guess who we're ultimately worshipping!

So to say that we should worship all the time is a misnomer. We do worship all the time. Everything we do is worship. Make sure with all your heart and your motives that you are worshipping *God*. To worship anything else leads only to destruction, but living a life of worshipping God leads to life, both now and forever.

FCC's leadership team is dedicated to studying what it means be a scriptural leadership. We understand that before we can look at anyone else, we must take a good, solid look at where we are as elders and ministers. We invited a well-respected brother in Christ from Lincoln Christian University, Dr. Don Green, to guide us in a study of Biblical Leadership. Dr. Green effectively shared from Scripture and from his own experiences what God's plan is for leadership in His church. Through this process of study, prayer and reflection we have come to adopt a purpose statement for our leadership team. It reads:

The Leadership Team serves on behalf of Christ, His church, and those He desires to reach through First Christian Church to guide God's flock, guard God's family, and govern God's people. (Acts 20:28-32; 1 Peter 5:1-4)

We have come to know that we are to function as an eldership in a new and vital way for God's glory and honor at First Christian Church. We believe to be empowered by God and accountable to Him to do these three things: GUIDE His flock, GUARD His family, and GOVERN His people. Just as God has empowered us, we choose a model of leadership centered on empowerment, truth, and accountability.

This coming March, Phil will teach in much more detail what this purpose statement means, but suffice to say we are dedicated in seeing ourselves and brothers/sisters in Christ follow a biblical standard when it comes to leadership in the church. We ask that you continue to pray for us as we seek God's will and plan for this church. We expect that God will change some things, and call us all to adapt to His will, so please pray for our church as well. May God be glorified by our unity to move in accordance with His will.

Rooted

I recently read an article about a kindergarten girl from Kansas who was strongly convicted. Her teacher instructed her, along with the rest of the class, to color in a picture of a Jayhawk, the mascot of the University of Kansas. This exercise was part of the kindergarten class' celebration of the state of Kansas. This little girl refused on the grounds that she did not like the Univer-

sity of Kansas. She took the Jayhawk sheet she had been handed, walked up to her teacher and asked for a Powercat (the mascot of Kansas State) to color. When she was told there weren't any Powercats to color, she threw the Jayhawk in the trash.

When the teacher approached her mother about the issue, the girl reluctantly apologized and then agreed to color the Jayhawk. After she got credit for the assignment, she went home and immediately threw it in the trash.

This is a cute story but it shows that conviction is powerful. It drives a person to act or not to act. It weighs on the emotions and has the power to send people out of their comfort zones. That is why it is so important for us to make sure our conviction is rooted in the right source: God's word. It is easy to let the source of our conviction be our personal desires, our upbringing, or our life experience. However, if it is not rooted in God's word, then the source is wrong.

Once we know that our conviction is rooted in the right source, we must learn to control it. It is like fire. When it is controlled, it is a very good thing. Once it gets out of control, it is a disaster.

This month in Foundation Rock we will be teaching the kids about humble, God-rooted conviction:

Week 1 – Daniel interprets a dream, even though the stakes are high. (Daniel 2). Bottom line – Make the most of every opportunity to stand for God.

Week 2 – The fiery furnace. (Daniel 3). Bottom line – When you stand for what's right, others can see God.

Week 3 – The writing on the wall. (Daniel 5). Bottom line – You can stand for what's right, even when it's unpopular.

Week 4 – The lion's den. (Daniel 6). Bottom line – Get in the habit of doing what's right.

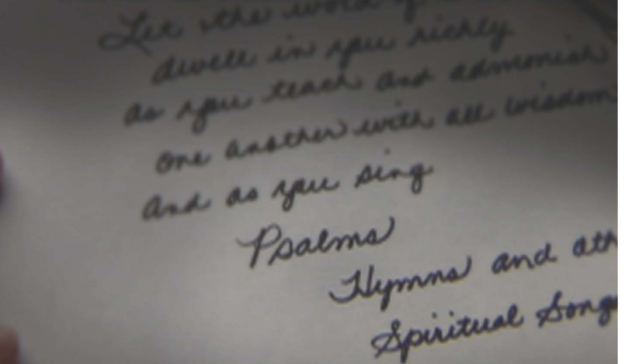

There is no doubt the Bible has a lot to say about money, and rightly so. Money affects nearly everything we do or don't do. Yet, for some reason, when we talk about money in the church, people assume we only want them to put more in the plate. This is not true. This is about living a generous, grace-giving life; being intentional with our resources to build relationships that lead others to Christ and glorify God. Now, does the Lord's church and work benefit from generous, grace-giving Christians...yes, but there are many other areas of your life that will be blessed.

Most of us are on the financial treadmill of working and consuming (I'm not sure which feeds the other). If we're not careful, this can dominate our energy and thoughts to the degree that our good intentions for our family get squeezed out. Because we want to consume more, we have to work more, which means we can't fully enjoy that which we consume. Meanwhile, we short-change ourselves with the time needed to build family relationships.

How can we master our money in order to be intentional in other areas? How can we turn our money from being a challenge to our spiritual and relational goals to being an asset?

Step One: Be content and faithful with what you have.

The writer of Hebrews wrote, "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you'" (Hebrews 13:5).

Step Two: Value relationships over things.

In Romans 13:8, the apostle Paul says, "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellow man has fulfilled the law." The less debt you have, the more you are able to focus on relationships.

Step Three: Trust God

God cares for you (I Peter 5:7) and He will take care of all your needs (Phil. 4:19). Trusting God frees you up to invest in family and to give generously to others who are praying for God's provision.
