Jesus is the only name that can save. His name has power. Philippians 2 says that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father. That is power! It's just too bad the people welcoming Jesus, listening to Jesus, eating with Jesus, didn't really know who they were with. They didn't know what we know now. I want to take you to a dark moment in the life of Christ. I want you to see the real Jesus as friends desert him and he still stays focused on what God asked of him. I want you to see how the unfailing love of a king is put to the test and comes out the victor in such a horrific event. **Matthew 26:69-75 says, "69All this time, Peter was sitting out in the courtyard."** So Peter was just a little ways outside where everything was happening. There's a good chance he could see or hear what was happening to his friend, his mentor, Jesus. **One servant girl came up to him and said, "You were with Jesus the Galilean."** ⁷⁰**In front of everybody there, he denied it. "I don't know what you're talking about."** This was the first time he denies. Could you imagine the internal, emotional and spiritual struggle he must have been having. ⁷¹**As he moved over toward the gate, someone else said to the people there, "This man was with Jesus the Nazarene."** ⁷²**Again he denied it, salting his denial with an oath: "I swear, I never laid eyes on the man."** This was the second time he denies knowing Jesus or even being with him. ⁷³**Shortly after that, some bystanders approached Peter. "You've got to be one of them. Your accent gives you away."** ⁷⁴⁻⁷⁵**Then he got really nervous and swore. "I don't know the man!"** This is the third time he denies any association with Jesus. He swears he doesn't know him. He lies about being with him. **Just then a rooster crowed. Peter remembered what Jesus had said: "Before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times." He went out and cried and cried and cried."**

Think about how you felt the last time your friends betrayed you. How did you feel when you weren't invited, when you were talked bad about by your supposed friends, when your friends didn't stand up for you when you were being attacked, when your friends believed rumors about you? It hurts! It makes you feel worthless, invisible and forgotten. Can you imagine the hurt in Christ's heart? Peter should have been willing to at least admit he was with Christ or that he knew him, but he wouldn't. Moments earlier he was ready to go to war so that Jesus wouldn't be arrested – he chopped some guy's ear off! But Peter leaves Christ when, as a friend, he should have done whatever to make sure he was with his friend.

I think we have something huge to learn about our relationship with Jesus from this scripture, but also about our relationships with each other! It's hard to build good, solid, lasting relationships, but it's easy to do something stupid that destroys them. What is loyalty really? Loyalty is faithfulness. It's staying true to your friends not only in the good times but also in the hard times. It's easy to stand up for what is right when everyone else is standing. It's easy to help out a friend when others are doing the same thing. It can be hard though to stick with a friend when something bad happens to them. Though he was accused, he was innocent. Why do we turn our backs on those who love us the most? Could you imagine the bond that would develop if you stood with your friends through everything, not just the good times! We expect that from Jesus, don't we? We say he needs to be with us no matter what! Then we end up turning our backs on him! We end up denying Jesus when we sin. We end up saying we don't know him when we act unlike Christ and stop imitating God. Though all of Christ's friends ran away or denied him, and even though he knew we too would turn our backs on him, he still went through with the torture, he still went through with the accusations, he still allowed the soldiers to take him to the cross to die.

Church Culture

If you've ever been to Jamaica, you've probably noticed something right away. They pride themselves on tourism. Kristin and I just returned from an anniversary trip to a resort in Negril, Jamaica (we left the kids with Grammy and Papa). It was an amazingly relaxing time and a much appreciated getaway. Jamaicans who worked at the resort would ask what we have been doing and it was great to reply, "NOTHING!" The local Jamaican culture is very laid back, and it makes for a great setting to relax. But there is something strikingly more noticeable than that. While the resort was luxurious, it was definitely out of character for the rest of the country. Once you get more than 1000 ft from the ocean (at most) things take a drastic turn toward poverty and ruin. Luxury and beauty are set diametrically opposed to slums, literally. But as long as you stay in the resort, you never have to experience any of the brokenness of the other side of the culture.

I feel like we do the same with our church culture. We have what we want here. We put on smiles and act like everything is "No Problem." And as long as we stay here, we don't have to experience the brokenness of our city. As long as we don't let the city in, we can have a nice, clean church experience. We can put up fences and post people at the gates so that the luxury doesn't get out and the slum doesn't get in. This should never be.

There are three things that we should do to counteract this sort of legalism. First, we need to be OK with messy people coming in. In fact, we should be inviting them in. Will it change the complexion (possibly even literally) of our church? You bet. These are whom Jesus came to save. Jesus' own words from Luke 5:32, "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." He didn't come to call the clean, but the dirty. He didn't come to call the healthy, but the sick. We are called as Christians to not only welcome them in, but to bring them here. Secondly, we must worship in Spirit and in Truth (John 4:23). This means to worship God through his spirit and with honesty. When we simply go through the acts of worship and don't truly interact with God we may not only be giving people an inaccurate view of who we are, but who God is. God is Spirit and we must worship him in Spirit and truth. No masks. No facades. No fake smiles. No empty motions. Just fellow sojourners walking toward the light of Jesus, longing to really experience who He is. And finally, we must let the luxury we have here out. We must not limit it to the walls of First Christian. We must spill it everywhere we step. We must smudge it on everything we touch. We must breathe it out with each and every exhale. We have been blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ (Ephesians 1:3) and we must, therefore, be a blessing (Genesis 12:3).

We had a great time in Jamaica, but I left with a sense of wondering if we had really experienced Jamaica, or if it was just a microcosmic mutation of the real thing. When people come here, when we bring them here, let us not show them a religious people who do the church culture well. Let us show them God in Christ through his Holy spirit as we really experience Him together.

While reading through these accounts in the Gospels I have noticed a recurring theme: Go tell.

When the women came and found the empty tomb, the angels told them to go tell the disciples where they could find Jesus. When Mary Magdalene realized that the man speaking to her was the very much alive Jesus, He told her to go tell the disciples that he was alive. When Jesus revealed Himself to the two disciples that He had met up with on the road to Emmaus, they immediately went to tell the rest of the disciples what had happened. After Jesus appeared to the ten assembled disciples, they quickly went to tell Thomas, the doubter, who was absent during the appearance. And just before Jesus ascended into Heaven He told His followers, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." (Mark 16:15)

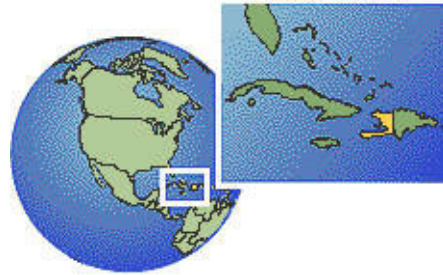
