## Let's Be Good Stewards of Our Facility

The Lord has blessed us with a beautiful and functional facility. Hundreds of people sacrificed to make this building a reality and our dedicated custodial staff and volunteers take pride in keeping it clean, attractive, and functional. Caring for our physical property is good stewardship and it is a continuous testimony to our commitment to Jesus Christ, who deserves the very best we can give.

To insure that our facility is properly cared for, we must all follow certain guidelines when using our building and grounds. These procedures are not designed to make it more difficult to administer our programs, rather they will help us use our limited resources in the most efficient way possible to better support our congregation.

The Facility Use Guidelines can be obtained at the church office. Here are a few points of emphasis:

1. Our custodians are part time and are not always available; therefore, it is important to keep our facility looking clean and uncluttered. A good rule of thumb is to leave the room better than the condition in which it was found.
2. Individuals using the facility are responsible for picking up unusual accumulations of trash, bagging or removing trash, rearranging furniture, generally tidying up. If used on a Saturday, then Sunday set-up must be done by user to the best of their ability. Diagrams for Sunday set-up are near each room door.
3. If you use any custodial equipment, please return it to its proper location as soon as possible.
4. Please leave a note to the custodian of any spills so a more thorough cleaning can be applied to the area of the spill.

5. All accidents and damaged property should be reported in an Incident Report (available in the church office) and turned in to the church office as soon as possible.
6. Reservations must be made through the church office. A calendar of church-wide activities can be viewed online at [www.fccsalem.net](http://www.fccsalem.net) or [www.fccsalem.ccbchurch.com](http://www.fccsalem.ccbchurch.com).
7. Notice of significant changes in room arrangements need to be made at least one week prior to the event.
8. Loaner tables and clothes racks must be signed out in the church office by recording the item borrowed, date, your name, and phone number.
9. Parents are responsible for their children who must be under their direct supervision at all times, unless the children are participating in a scheduled activity that has approved adult supervision. FCC members are responsible for the guests they bring.

The building is here to be used and our custodial staff and volunteers are dedicated to ensuring its readiness for our ministries' needs. It is a tool to help lead people to Jesus Christ and to enhance the fellowship of Christians. These guidelines ensure that the facility we have been blessed with can be used to its greatest potential. Please respect these guidelines and understand the purpose: to exalt Jesus Christ in all things.

It's not the end of the world, it's the end of ME... David was a great king. He had many accomplishments and gave much of his credit to God. He is known as the man after God's own heart. When someone is given a reputation like that you would imagine that they were selfless, compassionate, caring, a servant, that they looked like Jesus! David did have all of those characteristics, every one of them. However, another trait would get in the way and cause havoc in his life. I imagine it does the same to all of us as well. At the time we don't think about being selfish. We usually don't have forethoughts about being selfish. There aren't any plans devised to see just how selfish one can be. It's something that happens when we aren't living close to God. You've heard the saying before, I've heard it all my life, "When you feel far away from God, God hasn't gone anywhere; we are the ones who have moved."

Take a moment and read through **2 Samuel 11-12....** Our own desires and wants can easily get the best of us. If we don't die daily to who we are and allow Christ to lead our lives and live through us, we are going to fail. Selfishness affects not only us, but also those around us.

*Selfishness makes you think you are above everyone, even God.*

*Selfishness makes you do things you normally wouldn't do.*

*Selfishness alienates you not only from those closest to you, but from God.*

How many of you like to be around selfish people? How many of you, when at a selfish moment, are thinking about God? Kyle Idleman says, "*Jesus came to kill you; for you to die to yourself and live for God.*" If we are to truly follow God we have to die to ourselves and allow Christ to live in and through us. That is the only way God will get all the glory. That is the only way we will completely obey God.

David realized it's not about him. When confronted he didn't argue, deny or make up excuses. He got right back with God. *So the question is, how we can reckon with God?* We too, need to get right back at it with him. David was corrected, shown his mistake, confessed asked for forgiveness and sought out God. In Psalm 51:1-2; 10-12 David says, "***Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.***" We need to confess our mistakes, our selfish acts and we need to fall down before God asking for forgiveness. Then we need to know He hasn't moved, but that He's waiting for us to talk with Him and spend time with Him again. We have to remember that it's not about us! This life is not about you!

Take a moment and read through **Ephesians 3:14-21...** With God living in and through you, you can't lose. You will be on the right track. You will have the right heart. You will have the attitude of Christ shining out of you. But it starts inside and it starts with you. You have to decide to live for Christ. You have to choose to live like Him. You have to choose to grow, to be committed, to push yourselves to become more like Jesus. It will be the best choice you ever make and it will resonate through everything you do for the rest of your life. This life is not about you. It's about God. Let this be the end of an era of ME and let us be a generation who live for Christ alone!

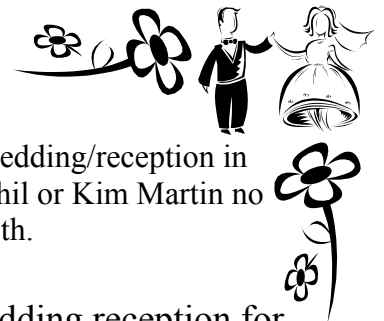

**Empty Nesters**

Achieving the long-term goal of raising your kids and then releasing them into “the wild” is one of those milestones in life that can lead to surprising emotions. One day you might feel relieved to catch your breath after such an intense marathon and then the next day you miss the busyness—especially the ever-present relationships that go along with having kids. Whether you are approaching, just hitting or deep into the empty nest season you are likely experiencing a range of feelings that can leave you asking yourself “What’s next?” This would be a great time to take steps toward rediscovery in your life.

**Rediscover Your Marriage**

You may feel like the tsunami of kids that swept in and out has left you needing to rediscover the person to whom you said “I do” so long ago. Proverbs 5:18-19 says, “May your fountain be blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth.” Now that your stretch of parenting is over, how can you find fresh ways to rejoice in the marriage of your youth and to “be ever captivated” by your spouse? You may just need to reintroduce yourself (“Hi, I’m that guy who asked you out a couple of decades ago,” or “I’m that girl you met at church”) and start rediscovering some of your earlier passions and dreams.

**Rediscover Your Children**

During earlier parenting stages, you had some fairly clear lines of authority and control, especially when it came to your house rules. Those lines blur as your children become independent—even if they boomerang back home for a season. Now is the time when your influence is built upon a strong relationship rather than direct control. Your efforts will focus on coaching your adult children into self-sufficiency and into pursuing career, marriage and building families of their own. This season requires a lot of trust because “sideline coaching” is all you can offer rather than step-by-step direction. But this season also gives you a vantage point to see the time and effort you’ve invested into your children in a different light—especially as they begin to take ownership of the values you’ve tried to instill (Psalm 78:3-7) and watch them discover God’s plan for their lives.

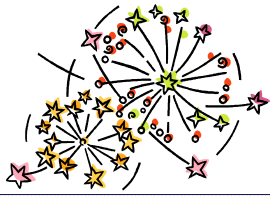
**Rediscover Your Mission**

Psalm 90 gives empty nesters a sober reminder of the passage of time, but also a wise prayer for the Lord to “teach us to number our days aright” and to “establish the work of our hands.” A major segment of your life up to this point has been committed to serving and guiding your children. That faithful and daily focus on individuals within your home has been preparing you for broader service. In I Timothy 3:5 Paul asks the question, “If anyone does not know how to manage his own family, how can he take care of God’s church?” Another way to see that passage is that those who have managed their families have learned a couple of things about how to care for God’s church—how to love, forgive, guide, lead and encourage. Such characteristics developed in the last season, as well as the additional time and resources that often come with an empty nest, can equip you for a whole new world of opportunities to fulfill your mission during this exciting season of life.

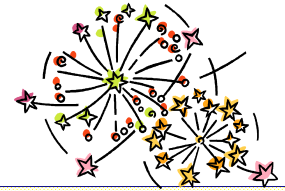
