## **2011 Fall Student Ministry**

The student ministry this fall will see some changes. In an effort to provide a more effective and experiential ministry, the student ministry is making some simple scheduling changes.

H2O is a significant part of the teen experience at FCC. The H2O program is moving from Wednesday's to Sunday's at 6:00 – 8:00 PM. By changing dates we hope to incorporate a more diverse ministry in one evening. Of course the worship experience associated with the past will continue, and we hope to use the added time for some new features. New to H2O will be break-out sessions. Break-out sessions are a tool used to develop mutual relationships with our peers, as well as spend some more time in the Word to develop a deeper relationship with God. H2O kick off is September 11<sup>th</sup>.

Since H2O is moving to Sunday nights, the teen small group ministry must also make a scheduling change. Our Small Group will meet on Wednesday nights from 6:30 – 8:00PM at the Will & Michelle Webb home. The small group ministry kicks off September 14<sup>th</sup>.

As for the Interim Student Minister position, it is important we understand that this is an immediate fix to our current situation, but not a long term solution. There are number of things to be worked through this fall, including the obvious search for a full time Student Minister. So I request your prayers be given for the youth ministry at FCC. My prayer is that God would send the right man for the ministry, and FCC would see great success in its youth programs.

As I have full time employment already, please understand that everything cannot be accomplished by me. My focus will be multi-faceted but there will not be enough time to do everything that is needed. In all things we do we hope to bring glory to God, and I hope as I center my attention on student relationships, leadership development, H2O, and small groups that He will be brought much honor.

If you have served in the Student ministry in the past, or desire to minister to our youth now and in the future, plan on coming to a meeting on August 28<sup>th</sup> at 8:15AM at FCC. We will continue planning together for this fall's program. So if you are interested in helping, whether teen, college age, young adult, parent, or grandparent; plan on coming to the meeting.

Beginning in September we will be making some changes in the way we approach our worship service. This article is meant to provide you with an understanding of how we plan worship and what you should expect from a weekend service. There are three considerations when planning and carrying out a worship service. They are addressed in order of importance, the most important being content.

## Content

The Content of Christian Worship is Always Jesus. We will present the entire gospel through different mediums which will include music, the spoken word, sacred actions, drama, video, and other artistic expressions. Everything we do will be rooted in scripture for the purpose of praising and thanking God first and foremost, gaining a greater understanding of the God we worship, and edifying the body.

## Structure

We will seek to present a structure consistent with an understanding of worship found in scripture. It will seek to be generally dialogic in which God speaks and then we act. God is always the initiator of worship and we respond. Also, God first revealed himself in the Old Testament and the prophets (which is demonstrated through the teaching of His word) and then he sent his Son Jesus to act on His Love for us (which we celebrate by re-enacting the Lord's Supper). We will be employing a structure known to some as the Four-Fold order.

**Gathering** - The time we come together. This would include the Call to Worship, prayers, songs, scriptures, videos, sketches, etc. It would, at most times, be the largest portion of our musical worship.

**Word** - This is the Sermon or teaching portion of the service. It would include the spoken word and possible videos or dramas that help the teaching, and an invitation when appropriate.

**Table** - This is the portion of the service that we partake of the Lord's Supper together. It would include prayers, instructions (whether teaching or logistics), videos, music, and the sharing of the cup and loaf. It would be followed by the taking up of the offering.

**Dismissal** - The time we send people out to worship through the week. It would include encouraging words, possibly announcements for the church body, and instructions to worship, and more than likely music.

## Style

Style will be our last consideration. We will seek to pull from various styles including the most recent and ranging to some older forms. Most of our diet of style will be considered "contemporary" in nature. We will always include a hymn (in original setting or a more contemporary treatment). We will consider all styles as acceptable for worship and only content will determine use.

This large change in mindset and approach, coupled with a smaller, meaningful change in the way we order our services has the ability to greatly impact the way in which this congregation worships. It is time for us to look at Jesus in a new light, seeing Him again for who He is. Pray with us as we seek to always be in step with where God wants us to be. Pray with us as we seek to truly put our best foot forward. Pray for us as these changes will disrupt some of our set patterns that all of us might need to adjust. Pray with us as we seek to be faithful worshippers of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

### **FCC Children's Ministry: Moving Forward**

What can we do to better minister to kids? I have been seriously considering this question for nearly a year now. I have read books, articles, and blogs on children's ministry. I have interviewed several children's ministers from churches with attendance ranging from 350 people to several thousand people. I have been praying about it and discussing it with the leadership of FCC and through all of this we have come to 2 major conclusions.

#### **Conclusion number 1: Our main emphasis needs to be on Sunday mornings.**

In the past, our best program for the kids was on Wednesday nights. However, Sunday morning is when families come together. This is also when we see more visitors, so this is when we need to give our very best. So, starting September 11<sup>th</sup>, Kidz Church will become Foundation Rock. We will have the kids upstairs for the **entire service** rather than just the sermon portion. Parents will check their kids in and out before and after the services.

**During 2<sup>nd</sup> service** the kids will experience interactive skits and activities, high energy worship, an experiential lesson, an age appropriate communion time, and at the end of the service kids will split off into age appropriate small groups that will help them apply the lesson to their lives.

**During 1<sup>st</sup> service**, due to the smaller number of kids and available volunteers, we will simply have a lesson, an activity, and a communion time for those who have been baptized. However, we will still have the kids upstairs the whole time.

#### **Conclusion number 2: We need to focus more on age-appropriate teaching.**

Currently, we have Kindergarteners through 6<sup>th</sup> graders all lumped together for the church service. This is a huge age gap and unfortunately the kids suffer because of it. The Kindergarteners – 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are just learning what this God thing is all about. They need more of an informational style of teaching.

However, the pre-teens are at a point in their lives where they are asking some big questions and trying to figure out how to own their faith. They need more of a transformational style of teaching. They are asking questions that are far above the younger kids' heads and it is difficult to meet everyone's needs effectively with these two groups together.

So, we have put together a plan to build up Foundation Rock to a point where we will need to split it into 2 programs within a year or two. We will then have an early elementary program (K-3<sup>rd</sup> grades) and a pre-teen program (4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grades). By doing this on Sunday mornings we will have the space to run these two programs at the same time. This will allow us to meet the kids' spiritual needs more effectively.

Due to the amount of time, resources, volunteers, and energy that will be required to pull off these big changes, we will no longer have a Wednesday night program for the kids. Believe me when I say that I will miss the Wednesday night program. However, I foresee major benefits headed our way because of these changes. It is going to take a lot of work, but it will be worth it. I firmly believe that.

I will present more information about this on Sunday morning. Please come join us!

### **From Communion Serving Schedule to Serving Teams**

In the past few weeks, we have mentioned that four teams equipped with a leader will replace the availability scheduling that we are currently using for servers in the worship service. If you have read the notices you know that if you are normally scheduled you will be placed on a specific team that will serve on the same week each month. Team 1 = Week 1, etc. If you are a deacon or are regularly scheduled you will be contacted about your team placement. You may also know that these teams are set to take effect the first weekend in September and that we also need more people to fill out the four teams. If you would like to volunteer, we would love to get you involved.

Here are some things that you don't yet know that will be important for you to know. With a change in the order of the service there are some changes in the way in which the team functions during the service. First of all, no one will sit up front waiting to serve. With the sermon coming before the Lord's Supper, we want you to sit with your family and worship. Each week everyone on the team will be given a cue card to know when to get up and go to your serving positions, whether that be in the front or the back. Secondly, it will change the patterns that we use to serve shut-ins. With the timing being different in the service, the time you can get away will be different. Once the teams are completely full (around 20 people), those who are serving shut-ins will not need to help pass the trays during the service, creating ample time to complete this important ministry. And third, you will be contacted ahead of time on your week of service as a reminder and as an encouragement.

This is an important ministry in the church and with these changes we can be more purposeful, efficient, and accountable. If you have questions, please contact Dave Jarrett, Jim Martin, or Eldon Prosis. Or you can contact one of the leaders for the teams, Bob Lybarger, Bob Wilson, or Jay Luse. We are very excited to make this ministry of the church more intentional and purposed. If you are interested in leading a team, we are still looking for one more leader. Maybe God is calling you to lead.
