Meet Drew and Jade Peterson FCC Student Ministry Candidate

Drew and Jade Peterson were high school sweethearts and married in December of '08. They grew up in a small town (3,500) outside of Springfield, IL.

After graduating from high school Drew went to Illinois State University where he earned a degree in Economics in '10. Jade became a Registered Nurse and currently works on the OB floor. In her own words..."I catch babies."



Drew admits, "In March of '08, my life was pretty stagnant, spiritually. I definitely was living my life Drew's way and not God's way. That all changed at a Sunday morning worship service...I felt the call from God to go into ministry. That moment in my life has changed my life completely." Shortly after his call into full-time ministry, Drew enrolled at Lincoln Christian Seminary where he is pursuing a Master's of Arts in Ministry. He hopes to complete his degree in 2013.

As FCC's search team, staff, and elders have met with Drew and Jade, it is obvious that they are passionate about leading junior high, high school, and college students into a closer walk with Jesus Christ. So far, in their current 3-year ministry, they have experienced the movement of God as they've seen junior high and high school students come to Jesus.

November Sermon Series: Our Church

During the month of November, our Sunday morning preaching series will be centered around a few basics in our faith: our church, baptism, communion, and membership. There is a chance that you have never accepted Christ or been immersed into Christ. So, we want to provide you with some information to help you in your decision. If you would like to discuss this, contact any of the staff, and we would be more than happy to meet with you.

Frequently Asked Questions on Baptism

1. What does the Bible say about the manner or method of baptism?

In the Bible, when you hear the word “baptism,” it is referring to immersion in water. The Greek word for baptize is BAPTIZO which means to dip, plunge, immerse under water.

2. When should someone be baptized?

- Baptism should take place when one has placed their faith in Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior.
- Baptism should take place when a believer has decided in their heart to repent of their sins and to live to please God. Baptism is not for perfect people, it is for people who need forgiveness and who desire to change.
- Baptism should take place when a believer has confessed Jesus as Lord.
- Baptism is for people who want to begin a relationship with Jesus, not for those who simply want to become members in a church.

3. Why should someone be baptized?

- **Matthew 3:13-16** - Jesus was baptized and He is our example.
- **Matthew 28:18-19** - Jesus commanded it and He is our Lord.
- Believer after believer was baptized in the book of Acts.
- **Romans 6:4** - To “live a new life” in Christ.
- **1 Peter 3:21** - It is the appeal to God for a clear conscience.
- **Galatians 3:27** - To “put on Christ.”
- **Matthew 28:18-20** - It is the mark of a disciple.
- **Acts 9:18 & 22:16** - The Apostle Paul was baptized.
- **Acts 2:38** - For the “forgiveness of sins.”
- **Acts 2:38** - To “receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”

4. What is the proper setting for someone to be baptized?

The Bible provides several different settings for baptism, all of which are very appropriate and meaningful. God is well aware that we possess different personalities. It is almost as though He gave us biblical precedent for a variety of settings so our baptism would be a meaningful experience.

- A very small, personal, private intimate setting
 - **Acts 8:34-38** - Only two people were present.
 - **Acts 9:18** - When the Apostle Paul was baptized, it is a possibility that only he and Ananias were present.
- A small group with family members present
 - **Acts 16:14-15** - Lydia and the members of her household were present.
 - **Acts 16:31-33** - The Philippian jailer and all his family were present.
- A small group that includes family and friends
 - **Acts 10** - The household of Cornelius and close friends were present.
- A large public gathering
 - **Acts 2:36-41** - After preaching the first Gospel message, verse 41 says, “Those who accepted His message were baptized and about 3,000 were added to their numbers.”

Worship . . . is It worth It?

Would it surprise you if I said no? I hope that you are a bit shocked at this point, but hear me out. Worship isn't anything in and of itself. The way we practice worship is not sacred or meaningful in a vacuum. There is a difference between worshipping God and worshipping worship. And we, as God followers, must be on the proper side of that fence.

The Bible has a lot to say about worship. It is full of instruction and exhortation. In the Old Testament there are rules and regulations for the sacrificial system as in the first seven chapters of Leviticus. There are descriptions on how King David centralized and organized Israel's practice of worship as in 1 Chronicles 15. In 2 Kings 23 we can see how King Josiah completely reformed Israel's practices of worship after rediscovering the book of the Law. The New Testament contains some descriptions (Acts 2) and admonishments (1 Corinthians 11), but unlike the Old Testament, has few rules and prescriptions.

There are a two main principles that I would like to highlight that come from both Old and New Testaments. First, God's worship is meant to bring everyone together. Unity is the biggest prescription in the New Testament for worship. Read 1 Corinthians 11:17ff and you get a strong sense of the need for unity and the distraction of division. But the more important principle that is absolutely essential when it comes to worship is this: **God is the most important aspect of worship!** Maybe that sounds like a no-brainer, but I don't believe that we can take Him for granted in this way. Far too often when we gather we worry about the music, how we dress, what time it is, how long things are, where things happen, what the room looks like, who we are sitting by, what we're doing after church, how loud or soft it is, what temperature the room is...I think we get the point. When we gather, we gather in the name of God, His son Jesus Christ, and His Spirit.

Consider this, the word "worship" is a shortening of the Old English word "worthship." We gather because of His worthship, because He is worthy of praise. We gather for worthship because He has invited and initiated it. We gather for worthship because He desires it of us. It is not our worship. It is not our worthship. We are not worthy. We cannot possess worship. When we try to, we make it about everything else other than God, the immortal invisible. We make it about us. When we say "our worship" we make the most important thing us. Maybe it is semantics, but we must see it in the light that scripture sees it.

Worship isn't worth it. God is worth it, and He is worthy, and he deserves the praise of His people. In fact, he inhabits the praise of His people (Psalm 22:3). If there is a difference between worshipping worship and worshipping God, let us worship God. "Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the LORD our Maker; for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care." (Psalm 95:6-7)

Safety Net or Rock?

So, life is going well. Most of your ducks seem to be in a row, everyone seems healthy, and there is no major crisis to deal with. You may not be on cloud nine, but for the most part things are pretty rosy. All of the sudden, BAM, something comes along and knocks you off your toes. You are about to go down and go down hard so you toss up a quick prayer and then, lo and behold, Jesus comes along and catches you just before you hit rock bottom. Whew! That was close.

Isn't it easy to treat Jesus that way? It's like He's a trusty safety net that's good to have around when you need it, but you tend to forget about it when you don't. However, the Bible describes Jesus quite differently.

This month in Foundation Rock we will be learning how to "Build on the Rock." Both God and Jesus are referred to as "the rock" several times throughout Scripture.

In Luke 6:47-48 Jesus describes Himself as the rock on which we should build our foundation. Hearing His words and doing them will cause us to stand firm through any storm.

Peter, in Acts 4:11, calls Jesus the Chief Cornerstone. He is where the building begins and from Him we receive direction. Every decision must begin with Jesus.

When God delivered David from the hand of all his enemies and from the hand of Saul, David sang the words, "The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge." (Psalm 18:2)

In Isaiah 26:4, God is called the "Rock eternal". We can trust Him forever!

Let us not treat our Rock like a safety net. Let us build our lives on Him so that when storms come our way we will be able to stand firm and that His name may be glorified!

The words “harvest time” conjure many different images in our minds. The farmer bringing in his crops, leaves turning colors, Indian corn, pumpkin pie, football, and, of course, Thanksgiving Day. God has also designed seasons in each of our lives, to bring about a harvest in us. It is a wonderful time that the writer of Hebrews describes as producing in us a harvest of righteousness and peace. Each of us would love to have this kind of fruit in our lives—to be right before God, more like His son Jesus and have that calm assurance that He is in control.

Farmers, who know all about the harvest, are, in many ways, connected to the land. It’s how they make their living. For some, their very livelihood and prosperity are linked to the harvest. Farmers who rely on a good harvest to make a living understand that careful preparation for the harvest will have begun months before any John Deere or Case combine can begin collecting ears of corn or bushels of soybeans.

I am certainly not a farmer, but I know enough to understand that a decent crop is not a guarantee. The land must be properly cultivated for a bountiful harvest to result. This includes plowing and disking the ground to turn the soil before planting, adding the proper nutrients to the ground, making sure plants get enough water to grow, and so forth. If I fail to cultivate the land to prepare it for planting or if I neglect my crops through the growing season, the harvest would be less than desirable. Every good farmer understands the need to cultivate and prepare the land, turning over the soil so nutrients, rain and seeds can make their way in deep. Proper cultivation sets the stage for a good crop and prosperity for the hardworking farmer.

This truth is no different when it comes to our hearts. Only a fool would think that his heart would reap a harvest of righteousness and take on the appearance of Christ without daily cultivation and care. Only when our hearts are properly cultivated can the Spirit most effectively form the character of Christ in our lives. Paul talks about this in Ephesians 3:17: “Then Christ will make his home in your hearts as you trust in him. Your roots will grow down into God’s love and keep you strong.”

That’s the kind of harvest God intends to produce in our lives. Strength. Depth. Character. The harvest is only possible if we’re willing to allow our roots to go down deep as we continually to trust in Him for the results.
