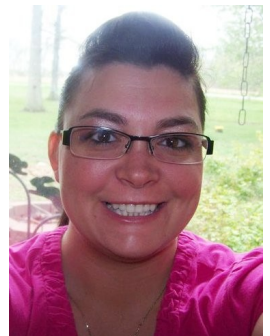

In a culture that gives value to elaborate spending and over consumption, there is value in remembering God's simple gift. And after further examination we realize that in God's simple gift of a baby in a manger actually lies the most extravagant show of love and affection for His creation. There is Joy in the birth of a baby. There is peace in His gift.

We can certainly give Advent a look, through the scriptures, and fully anticipate the coming of Christmas. And in doing so we may discover, or rediscover the meaning of the first coming and the implications of His second coming. And maybe, just maybe, we will begin the process of turning our Christmas celebrations away from the materialism and toward an opportunity to share the hope, love, joy, and peace of God this Christmas. I'm looking forward to it. Are you?

Giving Your Conviction Hands and Feet

God had laid outreach on the mind and heart of Jeff Baldrige for several years. He didn't know what, when, nor the how, but he felt the Holy Spirit tugging nonetheless. The big question was what to do about it? How could he put his passion and conviction into action -- give it legs so to speak? It's one thing to know the commands of Christ (they look great on paper), but putting them into practice...that's where the rubber meets the road, rather, that's where we put hands and feet to our conviction.

Jeff knew he would need help, so he started telling others of his desire to help less fortunate people in the community. It isn't easy to get others to buy in to your passion. We all have our own lists of ideas and priorities, and, quite frankly, we have very little room to take on any more, regardless of their grandeur. Jeff didn't give up; he kept sharing his passion to help others, and the idea of a community dinner was born.

Having a community dinner isn't a new idea, in fact, several churches in town help feed those in need. Plus having a community Christmas dinner were altered when it was learned that two or three other churches were planning the same thing in the area. Not wanting to overlap or take away from their efforts, the decision to have a dinner on New Year's Day was made. Like Thanksgiving and Christmas, New Year's Day can also be a particularly lonely time.

The response to help with this dinner has been wonderful. Teams are being formed to handle various tasks such as food prep, serving, publicity, setup and cleanup, transportation, and food delivery. If you would like to serve on one of these teams, then please contact the church office.

This really isn't about Jeff Baldrige, and he would be the first to tell you that. This is about a follower of Christ listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit to do something...and then do it. It's giving your conviction hands and feet.
